University vision for growing city

A MONORAIL, a university and extended grid roads are needed to help Milton Keynes continue to grow.

This is according to some of the city's key stakeholders, who met last week to discuss the ideas that should form part of the vision for the city's future.

At the meeting of the Milton Keynes City Centre Management (MKCCM) stakeholders, a panel, including MK Dons' chairman Pete Winkelman and Theo Chalmers, chairman of pressure group Urban Eden, talked about whether Milton Keynes still had a

big city mentality and whether its big ideas are big enough.

They identified key areas that should be considered in order to draw national and international attention, to ensure businesses and people continue to come to Milton Keynes.

Commenting on the meeting, chairman of the MK Chamber of Commerce Rita Spada said: "Milton Keynes, recently recognised by the Centre for Cities as a hub of private sector and start-up growth, has to take advantage of the present window of opportunity to set out its stall and fulfil its potential as an international city with a difference.

"We must continue to attract

and retain the people and business that will assure our future."

But some disagreed with what the panel were saying.

Isabella Fraser is a ward councillor for Campbell Park, and she said she is worried Milton Keynes could become a 'two-tier' city.

She said: "You get those living in areas where aspirations are not being met, like in Woughton.

"I'm hearing a lot of big ideas, but seeing no grand work to bring everyone up to the same level."

25 firefighters tackle warehouse blaze

SWIFT action by firefighters prevented a blaze in a warehouse from spreading to three other units.

Crews from Bletchley, Great Holm and Broughton were called to the PHS Bathroom Showroom in Holdom Avenue, Bletchley, at 6.20pm on Friday.

At the fire's peak there were 25 firefighters at the scene.

Watch manager Dominic Smith, the incident commander, said: "The fire spread to the building, which was one of a block of four units, from two refuse bins outside.

"When we arrived it had bro-

ken through into the building, which was well alight inside.

"After forcing an entry, firefighters were able to bring it under control, limit the damage it caused and prevent it from spreading to the other units. They did a really good job."

Two teenagers robbed at knifepoint

TWO teenagers have been robbed at knifepoint in broad daylight.

The boys, aged 16 and 17, were confronted by two men who threatened them with a knife as they were walking back from the city centre to Oldbrook, via the underpass at the rear of Sainsbury's.

They handed over their wallets and £10 cash was taken.

The two offenders walked back towards the city centre in the direction of Sainsbury's.

One of them was black, aged 17 to 20, around 5ft 10ins, of muscular build with short black afro-style hair. He was wearing a black puffa style jacket, dark blue jeans and bright white trainers. This offender was carrying a knife with a six-inch serrated-edge blade and a pointed curved tip.

The second offender was white, approximately 5ft 8ins, 17 to 18 years old and of skinny build.

He was wearing a grey tracksuit with the hood up covering his hair, black trainers and blue cotton gloves.
